If you are not properly prepared to receive communion or are not Catholic (see back of this sheet), you may come forward during communion and cross your arms to receive a blessing.

BLESSING OF CANDLES AT CANDLEMAS, BLESSING OF THROATS, CATERED MEAL

Thursday, February 2 at 5:30 PM celebrate Christ's entrance into the temple which took place forty days after Christmas, the day when he was proclaimed as a light to the Gentiles. This occasion is traditionally remembered by the blessing of candles brought from home to be used for devotional purposes. The Mass on this evening will begin in the dark with the blessing, distribution and lighting of candles followed by an indoor procession and Mass. Following Mass two of the candles will be used for the traditional blessing of throats, which is especially needed during this winter season.

DECEMBER FINANCE UPDATE: ST. JAMES IS HEALTHY AND GROWING

Giving for December: \$8,409.51 | Monthly Average Giving for Past Twelve Months: \$6,935.51 (average giving at this same time last year: \$4,126.51)

December Expenses: \$5,383.00 | Covers quarter of priest's support, half of pension, travel, liturgical supplies, music, building rent and liability insurance, advertising, bishop's tax, almsgiving, hospitality

Capital Fund Balance: \$39,651.73 | Used for long term purchases, buildout when St. James is ready to move into long term leased facility, or to purchase property.

Our Own Space: help us increase our monthly average giving to \$10,400 in order to move into a leased space allowing for daily Mass, 24/7 tabernacle access, classes, gatherings, meetings, space for children's ministry, an office for Fr. Mayer. At our current growth rate we will meet this goal by summer of 2024.

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
