If you are not properly prepared to receive communion or are not Catholic (see back of this sheet), you may come forward during communion and cross your arms to receive a blessing.

It is also a good day to write, call or visit the mothers in your life (Mothering Sunday was celebrated for centuries prior to the American Mother's Day). GOOD FRIDAY STATIONS OF THE CROSS AT MARYWOOD RETREAT: APRIL 7, 2023

Remember our Lord's passion on Good Friday and participate in a devotion that goes back to the Blessed Mother who is said to often revisit the sites of her son's crucifixion. Meet at main parking lot (235 Marywood Dr., St Johns). Good shoes for stations walk along wide trail through the woods. Because the retreat center is closed that day, there are no easily accessible bathrooms, so please plan appropriately.

CHILDREN'S STATIONS: 10-10:30. You may pack some meatless snacks and a blanket or chairs to picnic at the beautiful retreat grounds. This is a child friendly opportunity to remember the significance of this day while connecting with other families.

ADULT'S STATIONS: 12-12:30 PM: led by Fr. Mayer. Reverent and prayerful opportunity to meditate upon the Lord's passion. Periods of silence and the Stabat Mater sung between stations.

EASTER DAY TEMPORARY LOCATION CHANGE: HARDAGE-GIDDENS CHAPEL, APRIL 9

The Mandarin Community Club, where we normally meet for Mass, is not due to the Art Festival which has been held there on Easter weekend for over fifty years. We will be back at our normal location the following Sunday. However, this little address change is in many ways a great blessing to us. It is becoming more common for us on Sundays to run out of room to put up more chairs, so this larger chapel will assure enough room for all of the people that the Lord has been sending our way, which is especially important on Easter. Also, the chapel is a beautiful space and quite the upgrade for us, which brings grandeur to this important high point of the Church year.

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
