However, the Church also permits you to receive in the hand, standing, or kneeling. If you are not properly prepared to receive communion or are not Catholic (see back of this sheet), you may come forward during communion and cross your arms to receive a blessing.

HOW TO OBTAIN GOD'S MERCY: A DAY ESPECIALLY FOR THOSE RETURNING TO THE CHURCH

Today, Divine Mercy Sunday is a day when Jesus longs to immerse sinners in the abyss of his mercy. The Church even provides a plenary indulgence which removes the extremely painful, purification that is needed after death prior to entrance into heaven (1 Cor 3). To obtain this indulgence: (1) go to Confession within twenty days of (2) receiving Jesus in Holy Communion on April 16, 2023, (3) pray for Pope Francis intentions, (4) be detached from the affection for sin, even venial (smaller) sins, and (5) take part in the prayers and devotions held in honour of Divine Mercy in any church or chapel. We will be praying together the Divine Mercy Chaplet here at Saint James directly following Mass.

RECEIVING COMMUNION ON THE TONGUE? PLEASE REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING:

1. ANGLE HEAD: Rotate your head as though looking up toward the ceiling.
2. EYES CLOSED: People who keep their eyes open tend to move their heads toward the host which makes it difficult for the priest to give communion.
3. DO NOT LEAN FORWARD: This causes your tongue to point toward the ground making the Blessed Sacrament more likely to fall.
4. SILENCE: Amen is not said in this form of the Mass.

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
