If you are not properly prepared to receive communion or are not Catholic (see back of this sheet), you may come forward during communion and cross your arms to receive a blessing.

St. James is a Roman Catholic mission of the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter, a diocesan like structure established by the Vatican in 2012 which is becoming known for bringing unity among Christians fervent preaching the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, the evangelizing power of poetically beautiful and reverent liturgy, and bringing together a dedicated community of believers. Though originally established in response to Anglicans wanting to come into the Church with their liturgical and pastoral traditions, it is now composed of Catholics of all backgrounds and has been thriving and has established over forty missions and parishes and counting throughout North America. The Ordinariate is led by Bishop Steven J. Lopes, who was appointed by Pope Francis in 2015. St. James has been in Jacksonville since 2019. Thank you for being here today. OPPORTUNITY FOR PLENARY INDULGENCE TODAY, HERE AT ST JAMES

A plenary indulgence (removal of all temporary consequences of sin, i.e. time in purgatory) is granted to the faithful who make a visit to a parish church on the Solemnity of its Title, and there devoutly recite an Our Father and the Creed. Standard conditions apply: a firm commitment to stop sinning, sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Pope. Because the Solemnity of St. James here at the mission this is your opportunity to push the reset button on your purgatory time!

WE ARE WORKING ON LEARNING THE CREED IN LATIN DURING THE SUMMER

Learning at least some of the parts of the Mass in Latin is something that is asked of us by the Church. This is so that when the faithful come together from different countries, they can sing together at least some of the parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin, at the minimum, the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. You can read more about this in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, which is found in the beginning of every Roman Catholic altar missal and contains instructions for the Mass. If you are struggling, check YouTube which has some great videos of the Creed or Credo, sung in Latin with which to practice.

CAPITAL FUND GIVING: PREPARING FOR LONG TERM MINISTRY AND A STABLE LOCATION

Do you have a heart for moving the community of St. James into a long term leased space or for purchasing needed liturgical vestments, altar improvements or other long term supplies? Mark your check or envelope for the Capital Fund. This allows 100% of your giving to go to this fund, unlike the general fund of which 13% is assessed (taxed) by the Diocese.

FINANCE UPDATE:

General Fund Giving for June: \$7,281.60 | Monthly Average Giving for past twelve months: \$7,176.09 (average giving at this same time last year: \$6,005.93). Help us increase our monthly average giving to \$11,000 in order to move into a leased space allowing for daily Mass, 24/7 prayer, classes, gatherings, meetings, space for children's ministry, an office for Fr. Mayer. At our current growth rate, we hope to meet this goal during 2024 or earlier.

Capital Fund Giving for June: \$2,070 | Needed for buildout in space we hope to lease and for other long term purchases such as a tabernacle, altar, comfortable chairs, speakers, signage, art and statues.

June Expenses: \$5,589.45 | Covers quarter of priest's support, half of pension, travel, liturgical supplies, music, building rent and liability insurance, advertising, bishop's tax, almsgiving, hospitality

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
