TODAY: WELCOME NEW CANDIDATES FOR ENTRY INTO THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

At the beginning of the 10:15 AM Mass I will be leading special ritual of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens (unbaptized); and Candidates (already baptized). These are the first of several Order of Christian Initiation Rites (OCIA) and the first public rite for inquirers seeking to receive the Sacraments of Initiation and Reception into the Catholic Church.

- Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens: Consecrating and approving Justin Sobolewski as a new Parish member, and his entry into the catechumenate period of OCIA. Includes presentation of the Holy Bible.
- Rite of Welcoming of the Candidates: Blessing and receiving Melissa Adams, Haitham Habib, Isabelle Myers, and Lee Setzer as new Parish members, and their entrance into the catechumenate period of OCIA. Includes presentation of the Holy Bible.
- Welcoming Reception after the 10:15 AM Mass: held for all Parishioners to meet Melissa, Haitham, Isabelle, Lee, and Justin; and warmly welcome each of them to the St. James community.

The next OCIA ritual is scheduled for February 18, 2024, when they will be officially sent to the bishop for the Rite of Election. Thank you for supporting and praying for our catechumen and candidates.

Giving for December: \$29,223.80 (general \$8,886.50, capital \$20,337.30). This shatters all past giving records!

December Expenses: \$6,169.91 | Covers quarter of priest's support, half of pension, travel, liturgical supplies, music, building rent and liability insurance, advertising, bishop's tax, almsgiving, hospitality

Leased Building, Rough Goals (numbers may change based on outcome of lease negotiations):

- \$10,000 average monthly giving needed to cover operating expense: Complete 😊
- \$30,000 in reserves (three months of operating expenses): Complete 😊
- \$75,000 estimate needed for phase 1 of buildout: walls, plumbing, electrical, floors, chairs, lights. Complete 😊 (note: this low number takes into account us doing our own painting, flooring, and trim work which saves us \$35,000)
- \$50,000 estimate needed for phase 2: signage, kitchen, landscaping, sacristy cabinets, advertising, bathroom renovations

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
