REQUIREMENTS FOR LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT

Abstinence from meat during the Fridays in Lent is binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. Fridays outside of Lent continue as days of penance and expiation in union with Christ Crucified. Abstinence from flesh meat is first and foremost commended though outside of Lent another penance may be substituted.

This is one of the greatest gifts that you can provide for someone in need: a family member, a friend, or a deceased loved one. To do so, please contact Lori Adelfio at secretary@stjamescc.org to arrange the Mass Intention or complete a Mass Intention envelope which can be obtained at the Welcome Table at Mass. The date will be confirmed with you via email, so please include your email address on your Mass Intention Request. A Mass offering is usually at least \$10, though this can be waved based on financial need. St. John Paul II emphasized the graces that come when a Mass is offered. "The Church believes that she will be heard, for she prays in union with Christ her Head and Spouse, who takes up this plea of His Bride and joins it to His own redemptive sacrifice."

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
