PASSION SUNDAY, MARCH 17

The two weeks of Passiontide begin today signifying the entrance into this more intense time of Lenten preparation and meditation on the Lord's passion. Mass begins by praying the Great Litany, spoken at the 8:00 AM Mass and chanted in procession at the 10:15 AM Mass. Also the last remnants of the *Glory be* disappear from the introit which is chanted during the first incensing of the altar.

PICK UP A DIVINE MERCY NOVENA AND CHAPLET BROCHURE, MARCH 24

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, March 29 and leads up to Divine Mercy Sunday, April 7. (*novena is a nine day period based on the days of prayer offered by the disciples while awaiting Pentecost*). There will be a limited number of Novena brochures available at the Welcome Table that will guide you through these prayers (*remember to bring it back for the public praying of the chaplet on Divine Mercy Sunday*).

PALM SUNDAY, MARCH 24

The principal Mass (10:15 AM) the liturgy will begin outside of the building with the joyful blessing and procession of palms into the church while singing the loved, traditional hymn All Glory, Laud, and Honor, commemorating our Lord's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem at the beginning of Holy Week. Because everyone loves this Mass, it tends to be on the full side, so arrive early.

EASTER DAY, MARCH 31 | NOTE THE DIFFERENT MASS LOCATION

On March 31st we will be meeting for Mass at Hardage-Giddens Funeral Home Chapel located at 11801 San Jose Blvd, Jacksonville (*Do not go to the wrong Hardage-Giddens since there are two of them located on San Jose Boulevard. We are at the one down in Mandarin.*) at our normal times of 8:00am & 10:15am. The Mandarin Community Club, where we normally meet for Mass, is not available that weekend due to the Art Festival which has been held there on Easter weekend for over fifty years. We will be back at our normal location the following Sunday.

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
