WHY ARE SOME OF THE SONGS IN LATIN THE LAST FEW SUNDAYS?

At St James it is our practice to sing the Propers (Gloria, Holy, Holy, Holy, Lamb of God) in Latin during Christmas and Eastertide, since these are the Church's high seasons. During these times we are reminded that the official language of the Catholic Church is Latin and that we are part of a global Church that goes beyond local customs and languages. It is the desire of Mother Church that the faithful are able to sing at least some of the parts of the Mass in Latin so that when the faithful come together from different countries, they can sing together at least some of the parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in the international language of the Church. You can read more about this in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which is found in the beginning of every Roman Catholic Altar Missal. This is why we are singing in Latin right now.

BUILDING FAITH | NEW HOME FOR ST. JAMES — Rough Goals (numbers may change):

- \$10,000 average monthly giving needed to cover operating expense ✓
- \$30,000 in reserves (three months of operating expenses) ✓
- Phase 1: \$126,188 raised for phase 1 of buildout: walls, plumbing, electrical, floors, chairs, lights. ✓ *(note: this low number takes into account us doing our own painting, flooring, and trim work saving us \$35,000)*
- Phase 2: \$19,620 raise for signage, kitchen, landscaping, sacristy, advertising, bathrooms ✓
- Phase 3: \$9,161.11 of \$25,320 raised for stove, advertising, votive stands and vestibule décor

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
