PROCESSION OF THE MOST BLESSED SACRAMENT TODAY AFTER 10:15 MASS

The Church teaches that "when the Eucharist is carried through the street—the Christian people give public witness of faith and devotion toward the sacrament." St. Pope John Paul II wrote that this is a day of great joy, a reminder of Christ with us. The practice of Corpus Christi processions harken back to the later middle ages during the rise in Eucharistic devotions. In 1264 Pope Urban IV established the feast of Corpus Christi for the entire Church. Soon, these processions developed into splendid pageants of devotion and honor to the Blessed Sacrament. They are still publicly held, and often with the ancient splendor, in many countries around the world. Today's procession will concluded with Solemn Benediction (Eucharistic blessing).

JESUS THIRSTS: THE MIRACLE OF THE EUCHARIST—IN THEATERS JUNE 4, 5 & 6

Jesus Thirsts: The Miracle of the Eucharist is a compelling movie about the real presence of Jesus in, and the transformative power of, the Eucharist. Deep within each human soul, there exists an intense craving for connection, purpose, and love — a thirst that only God can satisfy. Yet, the question remains: How does one fulfill this yearning? The Catholic Church teaches that the Eucharist is the most profound means by which God shares Himself with humanity. However, a 2019 Pew Research Study unveiled a concerning reality: only one-third of practicing U.S. Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. BUILDING FAITH | NEW HOME FOR ST. JAMES — Rough Goals (numbers may change):

- Phase 1 Complete: \$126,188 raised for walls, plumbing, electrical, floors, chairs, lights. (note: low number is if we do our own painting, flooring, and trim work which saves \$35,000)
- Phase 2 Complete: \$19,620 raised for signage, counters, landscaping, sacristy, advertising,
- \$7,293.01 of \$50,000 estimate needed for phase 2: signage, kitchen, landscaping, sacristy, advertising, bathroom renovations (these numbers were last updated on January 31, 2024).
- Phase 3: \$13,634.71 of \$25,320 raised for warming oven, advertising, votive stands, vestibule décor

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
