WHY THE THEE'S AND THOU'S IN THE LITURGY? FAMILIARITY, NOT FORMALITY

Because what has become known as Sacred English, is often used within liturgy (think of the Lord's Prayer: "Hallowed be thy name...") many understand this type of language as archaic or formalized speech. And while beautiful poetic language has the ability to move the heart, without proper teaching or catechesis, this language can lead to the perception of a distant God to be approached only with the necessary formality and specialized wording and prayers.

Yet, in actuality, the opposite is true. Anyone knowledgably of the development of the English language knows that the terms thee and thou are the informal usage and the term you is the formal. Historically, in familial contexts such as a parent talking with a child the term thee or thou would be used. However, when you were speaking to someone of status, a judge, a teacher, your employer, you would use the formal term you. As English speaking society became more formalized, the informal usage was neglected and forgotten. No one wanted to risk using a term that might negate another person's status and so formal pronouns were almost always used. Yet, within the Mass these older terms continue to be used in certain places as a reminder of the Lord's closeness to his children. The Mass is a family setting and these words are reminders of our kinship, our intimacy with the Lord.

AM I ALLOWED TO PARTAKE OF HOLY COMMUNION?

CATHOLICS

All Catholics who are not conscious of grave sin and who have fasted for at least an hour, are welcome to receive communion. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome you to the celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion.

NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
